**Historic Walking Tour of Culver (\$2,000)**

*Antiquarian and Historical Society of Culver, Culver, Ind.*

The Center for Culver History will develop a historic walking tour of the Main Street and North Shore districts, Bungalow neighborhood and Culver Academies. Culver is a lakeside summer destination in northern Indiana. The booklet will be completed in May, 2014 followed by a public program in summer, 2014 and distribution at area festivals.

**Old Buildings Come to Life (\$1,275)**

*Cannelton City Schools, Cannelton, Ind.*

Cannelton high school students will research, photograph and write about 12 historic sites in the town. Their work will be compiled as a 2014 calendar.

**A Pocket Guide to Carroll County's Historic Bridges (\$1,900)**

*Carroll County Wabash and Erie Canal, Inc., Delphi, Ind.*

Carroll County's bridges will be inventoried and described in a brochure available to the general public and attendees of the 2013 National Preservation Conference in Indianapolis this fall.

**Guide to Carroll County, Indiana National Register of Historic Places: Sites and Structures (\$1,997)**

*Delphi Preservation Society, Inc., Delphi, Ind.*

Carroll County's 19 National Register listings will be highlighted in a brochure and web locator tool. Among the notable sites are the Delphi Opera House and the Courthouse Square Historic District.

**Primary Research of Sites and Structures in the Downtown, and State Street-Division Street National Register Districts in Elkhart, Phase II (\$1,500)**

*Elkhart Park Foundation, Inc., Elkhart, Ind.*

This project will continue the goals and objectives that were outlined in Phase I of the project – to research sites and structures in Elkhart's Downtown Commercial Historic District and State Street-Division Street Historic District. For Phase II, data will be compiled in fact sheets, photo inventories and occupant histories.

**Embassy Theatre Study Trips (\$2,000)**

*Embassy Theatre Foundation, Inc., Fort Wayne, Ind.*

Through two-hour tours of the Embassy Theatre, K-12 students in Fort Wayne and surrounding counties will learn how the community saved this historic theater. Study tours take place September through May, 2013.

**Akima Pinsiwa Awiiki Miami Indian Heritage Days (\$2,000)**

*Fort Wayne History Center, Fort Wayne, Ind.*

Monthly sessions at the Chief Richardville House will offer interactive architectural and cultural-historical programming on this important Miami Indian site, a National Historic Landmark. Programs will be held July through November 2013.

**Empty Rooms - Capturing the Stories of an Historic Estate in Search of a New Purpose (\$1,750)**

*Friends of Cold Spring School, Inc., Indianapolis*

Fifth and sixth grade students at Cold Spring School, the IPS environmental studies magnet, will research and record oral histories about their 39-acre campus, the former Sommers Estate. Student workshops and interviews will occur this fall.

**Bethel AME in the Community (\$2,000)**

*Friends of Bethel Community Development Corp., Indianapolis*

A digital walking tour, displays and a public program will be produced on Bethel AME Church, located on the downtown Indianapolis canal. Built in 1869, Bethel is one of four partners in the city listed in the National Park Service's Network to Freedom (Underground Railroad). The tour and programs debut in September.

**State House Virtual View (\$2,000)**

*Friends of the Archives, Indianapolis*

A virtual tour of the Indiana State House will benefit K-12 students and citizens who are not able to travel to the capital. Children and adults will learn about the three branches of government housed in the landmark and its restoration.

**The Development of a Viable Multi-Media and Walking Tour Highlighting the History, Heritage, and Culture of Historic Camp Chesterfield (\$1,700)**

*Indiana Association of Spiritualists, Chesterfield, Ind.*

An illustrated brochure and a DVD will showcase the unique architecture and grounds of Camp Chesterfield, home to a spiritualist community since 1890, which, includes a hotel and cottages, trails and gardens.

**Saint Clair Place Neighborhood: A Case Study for Rehab Vs. New Construction (\$2,000)**

*Indy-East Asset Development Corp., Indianapolis*

A booklet and website will tell the story of the Saint Clair Place Neighborhood revitalization project on the near east side of Indianapolis. Information about the success and cost-effectiveness of the rehab will be distributed locally and nationally.

**Historic Doors: Restoration and Preservation (\$2,000)**

*Noblesville Preservation Alliance, Noblesville, Ind.*

Noblesville Preservation Alliance will sponsor a August 2013 workshop and produce a video and brochure on the proper techniques for restoring exterior doors on historic buildings.
